

States Reporting Cases of COVID-19 to CDC*



President Trump last night signed the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (H.R. 6201). The legislation eliminates patient cost-sharing for COVID-19 testing and related services, establishes an emergency paid leave program, and expands unemployment and nutrition assistance. Moreover, the bill provides a temporary increase in the Medicaid Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP), and creates two mechanisms for coverage of testing for the uninsured — one through the Medicaid program and another through the Public Health and Social Services Emergency Fund.

Congress urged to allocate \$100 billion to providers in next COVID-19 spending package. The AHA, American Medical Association and American Nurses Association today urged congressional leaders to provide \$100 billion to front line health care personnel and providers and "direct the federal agencies to begin to infuse funds immediately so that they can afford to take the necessary steps to fight" the novel coronavirus outbreak (COVID-19).

OPERATIONS

SAMHSA issues guidance on informed consent during COVID-19. The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) is providing [this guidance](#) to ensure that substance use disorder treatment services are uninterrupted during this public health emergency.

Behavioral health resources for organizations and public. [National Council for Behavioral Health](#) is providing resources for behavioral health organizations (including facilities providing opioid treatment) as well as resources on how to support children and other family members who may be suffering elevated anxiety related to the outbreak.

PLANNING

Resource Reporting to Juvare (EMResource). Continue to report bed availability and PPE item inventory. Data will be used by the State in requesting emergency supplies and managing allocation. Strategies for Optimizing PPE. The CDC's updated series of [strategies for optimizing PPE](#) supplies includes distinct guidance for conventional, contingency and crisis supply levels with regard to eye protection, isolation gowns, facemasks and N-95 respirators. Examples: When no facemasks are available, possibilities include reusing or producing homemade versions of masks (for example, bandanas or scarfs), which would ideally be used in combination with a face shield that covers the entire front and side of the face. CDC states that in the absence of gowns, the following are preferable: disposable laboratory coats, reusable (washable) patient gowns, reusable (washable) laboratory coats, disposable aprons or a combination of clothing to protect from exposure to body fluids.

FINANCE & ADMINISTRATION

Montana Medicaid releases Telemedicine/Telehealth Services Policy. In its [March 19 All Provider Memo](#), Montana Medicaid permits qualified providers to deliver clinically appropriate, medically necessary Montana Medicaid covered services to Montana Medicaid members via reimbursable telemedicine/telehealth services (including telephone and live video) for the duration of Montana's declared state of emergency.

New COVID-19 cyber resources available. The AHA has released a [compendium of resources](#) for hospitals and health systems related to cybersecurity threats during the COVID-19 pandemic. In addition, John Riggi, AHA's senior advisor for cyber and risk, today [published a blog](#) offering four ways that healthcare providers and organizations can mitigate cyber risks during the pandemic.

Key Legal Issues Facing Healthcare Employers. In a pandemic like COVID-19, hospitals and healthcare providers face a unique situation as both employers and care providers. [This post](#) from national health law firm Hall Render outlines specific issues and considerations including safe workplace, ADA, FMLA, NRLA and others.

New Diagnosis Code for Coronavirus. The CDC [announced](#) that its new ICD-10-CM diagnosis code U07.1, COVID-19, will be effective on April 1, 2020, instead of Oct. 1, 2020. This off-cycle update is an exception to the code updating process established under HIPAA.

Moody's: Hospital financial outlook negative as coronavirus constrains cash flow. Moody's Investors Service today revised its outlook for the U.S. nonprofit hospital and health care sector from stable to negative, saying revenue will likely decline as hospitals cancel elective surgeries and other services to prepare for a surge of coronavirus cases. "At the same time, expenses will rise with higher staffing costs and the need for supplies such as personal protective equipment," the credit rating agency said. "...Ripple and lingering effects to the economy will also drive lower cash flow even after the outbreak is contained. These include a reduction in the value of hospitals' investment portfolios and potential rising unemployment or widespread layoffs that result in the loss of health benefits. The difficulties facing hospitals come amid increasing cash flow constraints, such as a greater reliance on reimbursement from governmental programs and a continued shift in treatment to less costly settings."
