



Senate Approves COVID-19 Relief Package That Would Add Funding for Hospitals and Small Business Loan Program

Bill includes \$75 billion for hospitals, \$310 billion for Paycheck Protection Program

The Senate this afternoon approved by voice vote the Paycheck Protection Program and Health Care Enhancement Act – a \$484 billion COVID-19 relief package – which includes an additional \$75 billion for hospitals, health systems and other healthcare providers. The \$75 billion, which is in addition to the \$100 billion included as part of the last COVID-19 package, would reimburse eligible healthcare providers for healthcare-related expenses or lost revenues not otherwise reimbursed that are directly attributable to COVID-19.

The package also includes an additional \$310 billion for the Paycheck Protection Program, which makes loan opportunities available for organizations with fewer than 500 total employees. These loans may be up to \$10 million and may be forgivable if at least 75% of the loan is used for payroll costs, among other terms.

Among other provisions, the package provides \$25 billion to support efforts to research, develop, validate, manufacture, purchase, administer and expand capacity for COVID-19 tests. Specifically, the funding includes \$11 billion for states, localities, territories and tribes to develop, purchase, administer, process and analyze COVID-19 tests, scale-up laboratory capacity, trace contacts and support employer testing. It also provides \$1.8 billion to the National Institutes of Health and \$1 billion to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for additional testing efforts. In addition, the Department of Health and Human Services Secretary will be required to issue a report on the number of positive COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations and deaths disaggregated by race, ethnicity, sex, geographic region and other relevant factors within 180 days of enactment.

The House is expected to take up the package on Thursday. President Trump is expected to sign the bill.

OPERATIONS

NIH panel releases COVID-19 treatment guidelines. A panel of experts convened by the National Institutes of Health today released [COVID-19 treatment guidelines](#) for healthcare providers, which will be updated as new data become available. Based on preliminary and published data, the guidelines include recommendations for two categories of therapy currently under investigation: antivirals, such as chloroquine and remdesivir; and host modifiers/immune-based therapies, such as convalescent plasma. Each recommendation includes a rating for strength of recommendation and for quality of evidence supporting the recommendation. They also include guidance on caring for critically ill patients

and using concomitant medications for treatment, such as statins and corticosteroids.

FDA temporarily expands hospitals' access to compounded drugs, authorizes non-patient-specific orders. The FDA yesterday said that it will temporarily forgo action against 503A compounding pharmacies that provide to hospitals certain compounded drugs without patient-specific prescriptions. The agency's [temporary policy](#) outlines specific criteria that pharmacies and hospitals must meet in addition to some conditions established in section 503A of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act. FDA says this new policy is intended to remain in effect for no longer than the duration of the COVID-19 public health emergency and will be modified as circumstances evolve.

FDA authorizes first at-home COVID-19 diagnostic test sampling. The FDA yesterday authorized the first diagnostic test with a home collection option for COVID-19. Specifically, the FDA [re-issued the emergency use authorization](#) for the Laboratory Corporation of America COVID-19 RT-PCR Test to permit testing of samples self-collected by patients at home using LabCorp's Pixel by LabCorp COVID-19 Test home collection kit. LabCorp said the home collection kits should be available in most states in the coming weeks to consumers with a doctor's order.

CDC updates COVID-19 laboratory testing FAQs. The CDC yesterday updated its [FAQs](#) on COVID-19 laboratory testing and reporting. Topics include accessing laboratory testing, data and reporting, serology testing and ordering supplies.

PLANNING

State of Montana announces changes, clarifies required data and resource reporting. In keeping with federal data reporting requests and requirements, and recognizing existing data collection systems already in place in Montana, DPHHS clarified data reporting by hospitals in this [memo](#) released April 16.

- **Juware/EMResource:** Continue to report bed availability and ventilator capacity by 8:00 a.m. daily.
- **PPE Survey Tool:** PPE data will be reported to a [new PPE Survey Tool](#) instead of EMResource.
- **COVID-19 Patient Survey Tool:** Used to collect hospitalization data, and only to be used at the direction of DPHHS officials following acquisition of confirmed COVID-19 patient.

LOGISTICS

Submit PPE needs to DES coordinator in order to ensure allocation. In order to receive an allocation of emergency PPE, healthcare organizations MUST [submit needs to their local DES coordinator](#). Allocation is ongoing and supplies are limited.

FINANCE & ADMINISTRATION

Listen Now: April 16 call with Montana health insurers. MHA hosted the [conference call with insurers](#) last week and is compiling answers to frequently asked questions. FAQs will be posted in communications later this week.

Gov. Bullock issues new directives on telehealth, expedited licensure. Governor Bullock issued today two new directives. The [telehealth directive](#) requires health insurers to provide the same coverage for telehealth services as for in-person services. It also expands access to the types of technologies that can be used to deliver telehealth services. The [licensing directive](#) allows expedited registration of licensed out-of-state providers in order to expand caregiver capacity during the COVID-19 public health emergency.

MT DPHHS receives \$2 million grant for behavioral health crisis services. The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration yesterday [announced grants](#) awards totaling \$110 million nationwide. The funding will increase the state's capacity to provide behavioral health crisis services, including telehealth, assessment, treatment, and recovery to people impacted by COVID-19.

Report examines pandemic's early impact on hospital finances. Based on March data from more than 800 hospitals, a [new report](#) by healthcare consultancy Kaufman Hall found median operating margins fell to -8% in March, down from 4% in February. Operating earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation and amortization fell 100% compared to the same period last year, or 13 percentage points in absolute change. The report also found that bad debt and charity care increased by 13% year over year.

COVID-19 highlights crisis in U.S. rural healthcare. The Bipartisan Policy Center today released a [new report](#) examining the immense challenges facing the U.S. rural healthcare system as highlighted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The BPC's Rural Health Task Force has developed recommendations over the last year to stabilize and improve the urgent problems challenging rural communities, including improving access to telehealth, offering short-term stabilization for struggling rural hospitals and providing multiple pathways to transform into models that are designed to meet the needs of individual communities.
