

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF MEDICAID EXPANSION  
ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF  
Intermountain Health St. Vincent, St. James and Holy Rosary Hospitals  
February 15, 2024

WHEREAS, Intermountain Health exists to improve the health of the patients and communities we serve;

WHEREAS, a significant body of research, studies and reports indicate that having health coverage is key to improving the health status of a community;

WHEREAS, a high rate of uninsured residents is linked to an increase in the severity of patient conditions, poorer outcomes, and higher costs as a result of delayed care and seeking emergency care for conditions that could have been avoided or managed through preventative care;

WHEREAS, the expansion of Medicaid in Montana has provided healthcare coverage to low-income Montanans who otherwise have few other options for healthcare coverage, helping to reduce the rate of uninsured Montanans by 45% and uninsured residents of Yellowstone County by 54%, uninsured residents of Silver Bow County by 57%, and uninsured residents of Custer County by 47% since Medicaid expansion was implemented;

WHEREAS, Montana is experiencing a behavioral health crisis, and Montana's expansion of Medicaid provides a stable payment source for behavioral health services including \$54 million in new funds for substance abuse disorder prevention and medication-assisted treatment to address the state's opioid epidemic;

WHEREAS, in 2021, Medicaid expansion in Montana has improved health outcomes and led to early detection of disease, including breast cancer screenings and treatment for 5,557 women and 2,785 colon cancer screenings which potentially averted 973 cases of cancer, mental health services for 34,156 patients, and substance abuse treatment for 5,750 patients;

WHEREAS, Montana has the 13<sup>th</sup> lowest rate of state general fund spending on Medicaid nationally and a lower rate of spending than peer states (CO, ND, SD, WA, WY), including those states that have not expanded Medicaid (SD, WY);

WHEREAS, Medicaid expansion has significantly grown Montana's economy according to a 2023 study conducted by ABMJ Consulting, which reported that Medicaid expansion helped create and sustain over 7,500 new jobs across multiple industries and generated an estimated \$475 million in new personal income and \$775 million in economic activity in 2022. For Yellowstone County, Medicaid expansion has supported 1583 jobs, \$113 million in personal income and \$262.5 million in local economic activity. For Silver Bow County, Medicaid expansion has

supported 317 jobs, \$19.3 million in personal income and \$46.3 million in local economic activity. For Custer County, Medicaid expansion has supported 65 jobs, \$3.7 million in personal income and \$9.2 million in local economic activity;

WHEREAS, Intermountain Health in Montana has remained financially viable due in large part to a reduction in uncompensated care levels since Medicaid expansion took effect;

WHEREAS, Intermountain Health is currently facing unprecedented financial pressures resulting from a 20% blended increase in expenses driven by wages, pharmaceuticals and supplies and paired with stagnant revenues in 2023 compared to the prior year;

WHEREAS, the payments received for caring for Medicaid patients represents 13% of St. Vincent Healthcare revenues, 14.4% of St. James Healthcare revenues, and 15.6% of Holy Rosary Healthcare revenues, which support the financial stability of our organization for all who depend on us for care;

WHEREAS, residents from our service area receive care not only from us but several other Montana hospitals, independent physicians and health services, and the ability of these providers to remain financially viable and continue to provide care to all patients may be negatively impacted by significant changes to or the sunset of Medicaid expansion in Montana;

WHEREAS, the Intermountain Health Montana Market Board of Trustees has a fiduciary responsibility to our community to plan for the fiscal impacts of any major known or anticipated event on the organization, such as the current Medicaid expansion sunset date of July 2025;


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, Intermountain Health in Montana endorses Medicaid Expansion and further recognizes that such support is consistent with our Mission of revealing and fostering God's healing love by improving the health of the people and communities we serve, especially those who are poor and vulnerable.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Intermountain Health endorses Montana's current Medicaid Expansion program, supports repealing the sunset of the program, and further recognizes our patients, caregivers, and the citizens of Montana and the local communities we serve have a compelling interest in ensuring our hospital remains financially viable and an economic engine for our surrounding area;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Intermountain Health strongly requests our legislative delegation and the Montana Legislature to repeal the sunset of the Medicaid Reform and Integrity Act passed in 2019 and protect healthcare coverage for low-income Montanans and the \$775 million economic engine it has created; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Intermountain Health in Montana will inform members of our community and local legislators on the impacts to local healthcare services should the Legislature not renew the program.
